Also during this time he has played Walter Burns in *The Front Page*, Alfred P. Doolittle in *My Fair Lady*, Felix Ungar in *The Odd Couple*, Harry Brock in *Born Yesterday*, George Bailey in *Merry Christmas*, *George Bailey!* and Pseudolus in *Forum*. Gary also appeared in *The American Musical* on both the SRO and Morgan Stock Stage.

Susan Cable (Choreographer) RENT marks Susan's 16th show for MPC, having choreographed *The Producers*, *My Fair Lady*, *Cabaret*, *Guys and Dolls*, and *Urinetown* to name a few. Susan has choreographed throughout the United States and Caribbean and has received the prestigious LA Drama-Logue Critics Award for choreography.
